Introduction of Diagnostic Patterns in Shang Han Lun

As a classical work of TCM, 'Shang Han Lun' (伤寒论) has been continuously studied, analysed and discussed by physicians since the earliest dynasties. The comprehensiveness of its related works is quite incredible, and demonstrates the significance of this work in the Chinese Medical system.

If we say 'Huang Di Nei Jing' (黄帝内经) signifies the foundation for the physiology of TCM, then 'Shang Han Lun' was the first integrated systematic work on pathology and clinical herbal prescription instructions. It was the first to establish a core treatment guide in TCM, known as 'Treatment Based on Syndrome Differentiation'. It discovered rules of syndrome differentiation and demonstrated principles of treatment in TCM.

In this seminar, we take an introductory look at some of these practical diagnostic patterns based on Shang Han Lun. Practitioners will learn how to use accurate 'Syndrome Differentiation' to enhance clinical results. Throughout this seminar, sentences in Shang Han Lun will be made easier to understand, and several activities, including self-diagnosis practice and clinical case studies will help practitioners consolidate what they have learned.
