Part A: Extraordinary Medicine - Protocols for Extraordinary Channel Treatment

Presented by Damian CAREY

The Extraordinary Channels play a significant role in regulating the other channels and are therefore, at the very least, crucially important for the practice of Chinese Medicine. A careful reflection on the nature of the Extraordinary Channels provides a way of re-introducing a philosophical and psychological basis to our understanding of human health. By using the four primary Extraordinaries in our practice of acupuncture we can not only treat physical disease states at a more fundamental level, but simultaneously, we can recognise, access and modulate the corresponding primary psychological states.

This presentation will give participants practical, easy to learn treatment protocols for recognising when, and when not, to utilise the Extraordinary Channels in treatment. The channels will be discussed in detail, highlighting their fundamental nature and character, describing the subjective experience for the patient and outlining the indications for treatment, both physical and psychological.

A thorough, forty eight slide Power Point presentation will be used to unfold the pertinent information in a visually clear and informative manner. Examples from my own clinical practice will be given. Participants will participate by reading each other's pulses.

Upon completion, participants will gain a far deeper perspective on the Extraordinary Channels and their clinical application. They will also learn a practical pulse diagnosis skill which can be immediately applied to their clinical practice.

This presentation will be attractive to all professional acupuncturists and students. It will be of particular interest to those who prioritise a psychotherapeutic perspective in clinical practice.

Part B: Chinese Medicine Exercise Qi Gong with 5 Element

The practitioners are able to prevent exchanging the sickness qi from patients. It is also great to teach patients as they need to help themselves to practise in each different part of 8 piece qigong even only simple movement with breathing.
