### Acupuncture Point Combinations: The Master-Key to Great Clinical Results

*Presented by David Hartmann*

Students often ask me what makes an average acupuncture treatment an optimal one. My answer always revolves around the point combinations used for the treatment. What is your strategy? Does it come from past treatment successes for certain conditions? Perhaps it's a point combination that a favourite author suggested? Maybe it's designed around a diagnostic tool you use like the Wu Xing/Five Element System or the Zang Fu Patterns of Disharmony?

In 2017 the international publishing company Singing Dragon commissioned me to write a book titled 'The Principles and Practical Application of Acupuncture Point Combinations' due for publication in August 2019. This came about as a result of me researching, gathering and generating information for my students. In the end the content got so large that I realised this information needed to get out to as many people as possible.

This workshop is a way for me to get this valuable information out to attendees before the book has been released. It's designed to get participants thinking about the reasons for their point combination choices via theoretical and practical discussions and activities. It will include wide-ranging point combination strategies/themes. Both theory and practical demonstration/participation are done on these point combinations.

On successful completion of this workshop, participants will:

- Be able to theorise, and then practically apply, a range of different acupuncture point combinations.
- Have a greater understanding of acupuncture point combinations.

The learning outcomes will be achieved via both theoretical, and then practical, participation. The workshop will discuss over a dozen acupuncture point combinations along with point combinations for over half a dozen Chinese medicine concepts. Lastly, participants will be provided with a copy of the workshop notes to keep.

### About the presenter/s

#### David Hartmann

David Hartmann has been an Acupuncturist for over 20 years graduating from the Australian College of Natural Medicine (now Endeavour) in 1996; David also completed a 'Master of Acupuncture' in 2009.

He has been a Chinese medicine lecturer for over 15 years in Australia as well as presented seminars throughout Australia, New Zealand, Germany, The Netherlands, and the USA. David has a textbook on acupuncture point combinations being released internationally in September 2019; he already has his 'Acupoint Dictionary' textbook which was published in 2009.

David was also awarded the best acupuncture presentation by his peers at AACMAC 2018.
